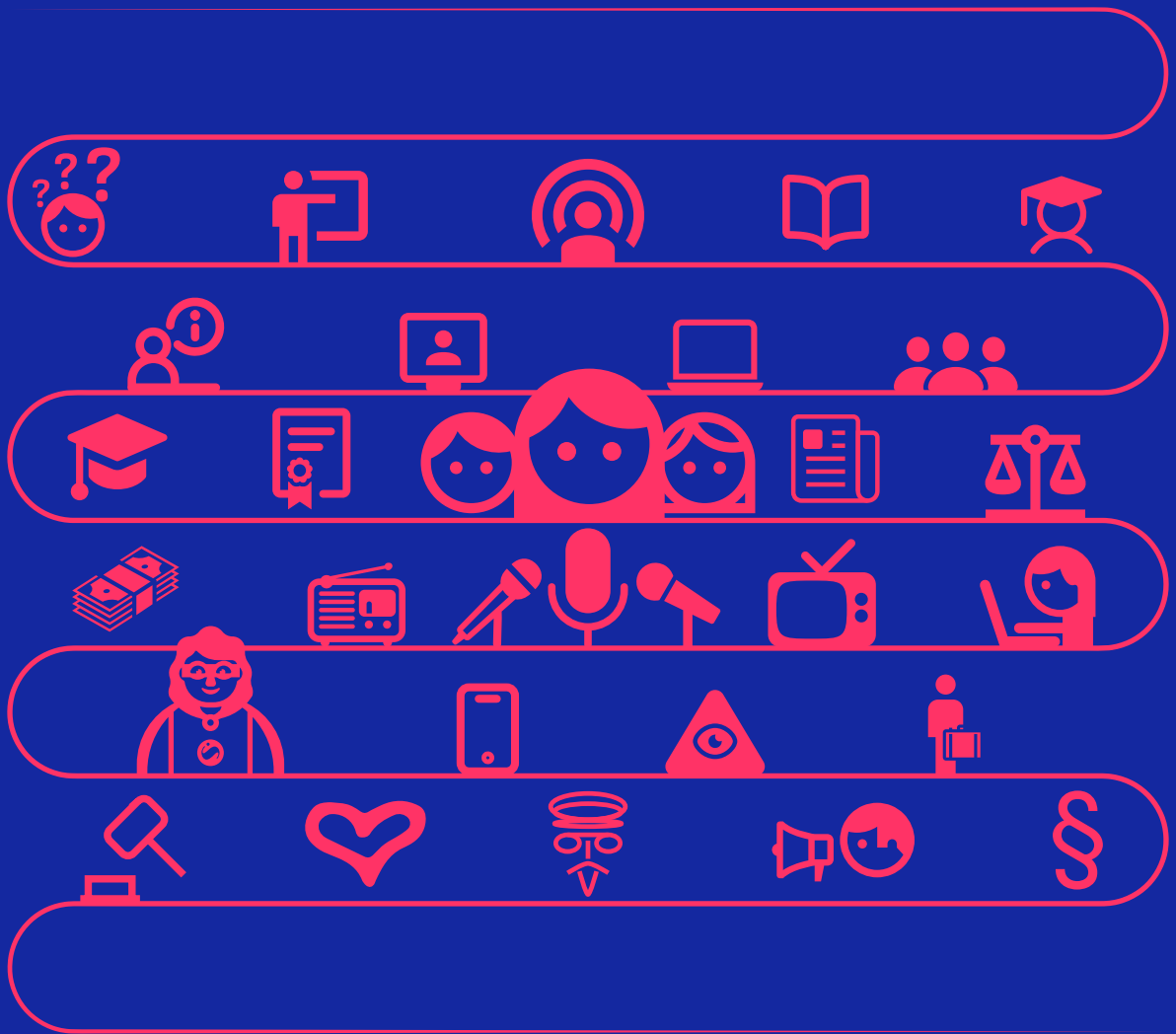

# INTRODUCTION

Dear friends,

It is my honor to present the first annual report of the Center for an Informed Society (CIS), which was established in the summer of 2023. We are facing a challenging period marked by the rise of populism and authoritarianism in our immediate vicinity. Following the parliamentary elections in Slovakia in September 2023, we are witnessing a shift away from a democratic trajectory, heading towards a dangerous path of autocracy. Will the Czech Republic be next?

We are in a situation where nearly half of Czech citizens [can envision](#) an authoritarian leader; society is increasingly frustrated, and interpersonal trust is eroding. Combined with the Russia-led war in Ukraine, we face threats to key democratic pillars. Populists, conspiracy theorists, and disinformation agents dominate the information space.

These trends led my colleagues and me, all from leading positions in the Czech civic sector, to establish an organization that will not only contribute to defense against these threats but also actively build a strong and resilient society that does not succumb to disinformation and the authoritarian tendencies of populists in the Czech Republic and Slovakia.

The lack of state strategic communication, irresponsible behavior on social platforms that allows the spread of disinformation, and the decline in public trust in democratic structures are the main factors causing this information vulnerability. Therefore, we provide analyses and specific recommendations on how to counter these threats. As part of our Security Academy project, we educate future foreign and security policymakers who will have a crucial impact on the country's ability to respond effectively to current and future security challenges.

Join us in our mission to ensure that the Czech Republic remains resilient against polarizing and authoritarian influences. Democracy is not a given, and it depends on each of us whether we wake up in a world where truth and love have won over lies and hatred.

# OUR PROJECTS AND ACTIVITIES

Since our official establishment in August 2023, we have primarily focused on projects and activities of the Security Academy for the rest of the year. However, we have also been intensively working in the background on the development of activities in our other pillars: Resilience in the Infosphere and Resilient Democracy, which have become more visible during 2024. In fact, we presented the intent of our activities, which we consider pivotal in the CIS, at one of the Center's first events, which was the Press Conference on October 3, 2023, announcing the launch of the Center for an Informed Society.



## SECURITY ACADEMY

The main initiative of CIS in 2023 was the Security Academy (SA), a year-long educational program designed for selected master's and doctoral students and recent graduates who are intensely interested in security and security policy. The Security Academy builds on a project of the same name, launched in 2020 under the auspices of the European Values Security Center. This program, which was created, coordinated, and successfully implemented by the current CIS team, continues to pursue the same efforts from its beginning.

All existing activities of the Security Academy were duly transferred to CIS to continue their development, including the exclusive right to use the licensed brand name "Security Academy."

At regular meetings with prominent security experts from the Czech Republic and abroad, participants have the opportunity to visit various institutions, non-governmental organizations, and companies active in the field of security in both the Czech Republic and internationally. Each participant is assigned a mentor based on their field of expertise, who helps them find suitable employment or internships that match their interests and professional knowledge.

**90 % of Security Academy graduates have found jobs in the field or continued their studies after completing the program.**



In September, we opened the selection process for students interested in joining the 4th year of the Security Academy. Among the 28 applicants, the quality bar was set very high, and from a pool of highly qualified candidates, we selected 10 participants. A key part of the program remains mentoring from experienced practitioners, including those from the Ministry of the Interior, Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Ministry of Defense, and the Army of the Czech Republic, among others. These mentors also consult with participants about potential employment opportunities. Additionally, we assist participants in obtaining internships at relevant institutions beyond the SA program.

**Since 2020, 34 students have completed the Security Academy, and 10 more were selected for the 2023-2024 edition.**



The fourth year of SA is supported by key actors in Czech foreign and security policy. We have received patronage from Vít Rakušan, First Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of the Interior, Martin Dvořák, Minister for European Affairs, Lieutenant General Karel Řehka, Chief of the General Staff of the Czech Armed Forces, and the National Cyber and Information Security Agency.

## Security Academy Activities for Students (September - December 2023)

The SA program also opened its third year for assistants of members of the Parliament with the goal of increasing their expertise and competencies in national security, defense, and foreign policy.

**Since its launch in 2022, more than 35 staffers from various political parties have participated in the Security Academy.**

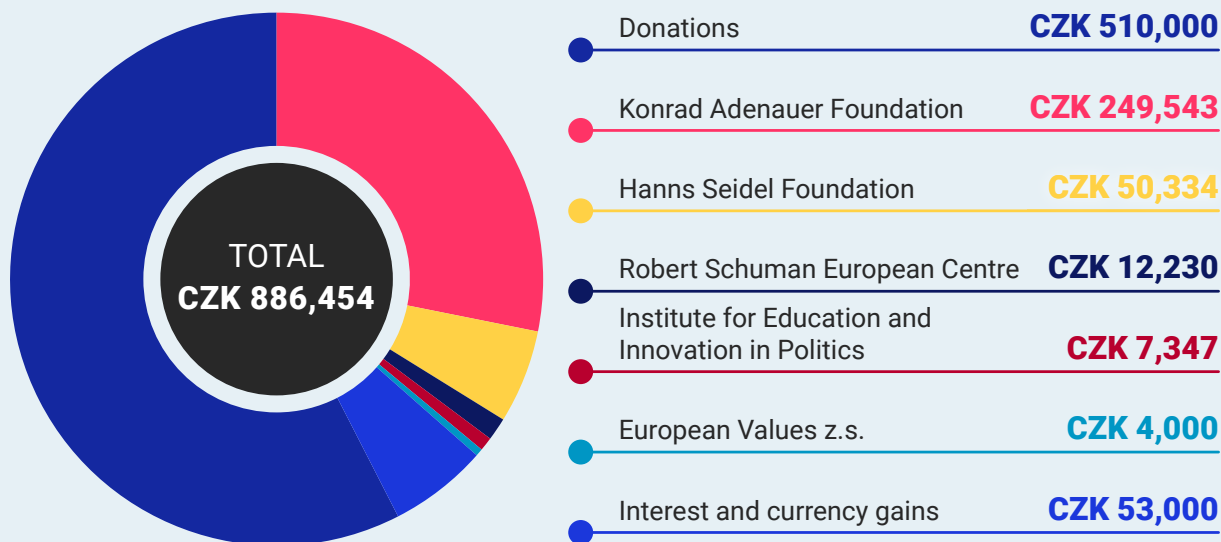

## INCOME BY PARTNERS

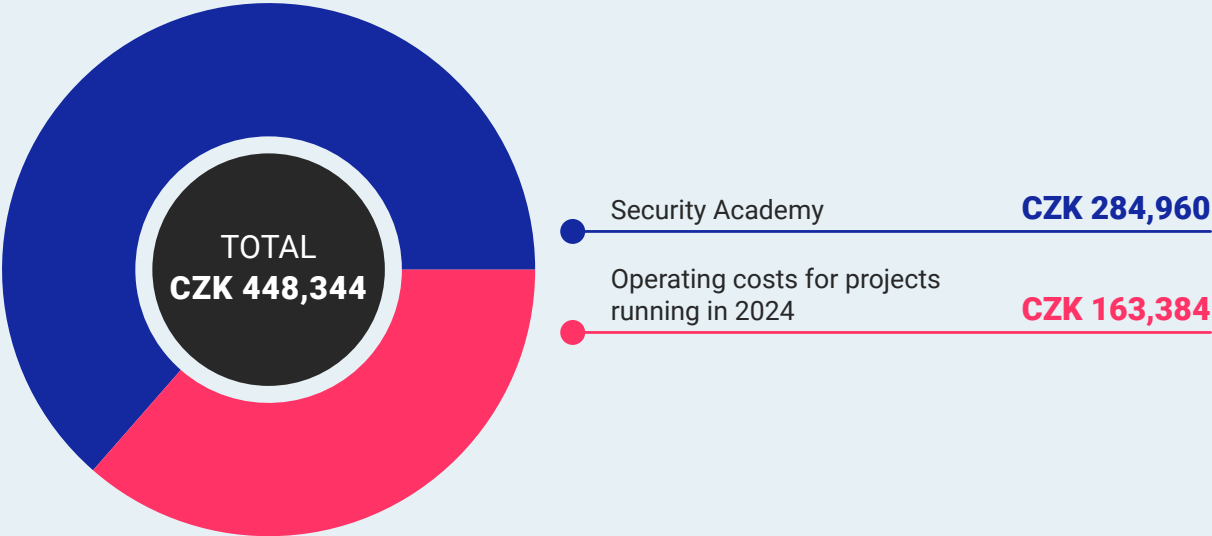


64 % of our total income came from private sources, while 36 % came from public sources.
